Plague has been used as general term for any great epidemic, but it is also a specific disease caused by the bacterium *Yersinia pestis*, named after the French bacteriologist Alexandre Yersin (previously called *Pasteurella pestis*, after Yersin's employer, the Institut Pasteur) Like many diseases, plague is a zoonosis: it comes to humans from
