Early Bead History Beads have been made by every culture and have been revealed in archaeology sites October 12, 1492, Columbus recorded in his logbook the natives of San Salvador Island were given glass beads This is the earliest written record of glass beads in the Americas His ships carried glass beads along with other European trade goods
